

The Tour, a turnkey formula

Your registration includes lunch, food upon arrival, cycling equipment*, professional coaching, insurance coverage and all other Tour-related expenses.

*Before the Tour, you will receive your equipment box (jersey, water bottle and socks) at the delivery address given on your registration form.



Supervision on the road - Discovery 50 km

The cyclists will set off in a single large peloton, escorted by several security motorcycles (police and organization motorcycles), and guided by several cycling supervisors. To ensure the safety of the group, we ask you to stay together as much as possible.

Support staff will be on board vehicles all along the route to assist you in case of need (mechanical breakdown, sweeper vehicle, first aid).

In the event of a flat tire, for example, or if you need to stop, please pull off to the side of the road (to the right, on the shoulder).

Supervision on the road - Discovery 80 km

Cyclists will be divided into groups of 15 or fewer, depending on your cruising speed, and guided by a cycling coach/group leader (an experienced cyclist in the group). Support staff will be on motorcycles and in vehicles along the route to assist you if needed (mechanical breakdown, sweeper vehicle, first aid).

Code of conduct

Compliance with the Highway Safety Code is required at all times (compulsory stop at traffic lights, for example), and courteous behaviour is always a must.





Twinning of the heart

One of the highlights of the event is undoubtedly the "twinning of hearts." Each cyclist is matched with a youngster, whom you will have the opportunity to meet, in most cases, at some point during the event. This child will also appear on your personal donation page, and you'll receive a button bearing his or her image, so that he or she can accompany you during your challenge.

To ensure your physical and technical preparation for the Tour, our partners are offering training sessions on bike mechanics and positioning, as well as a bike clinic (theory and practice). The Foundation team will also be on hand to answer any questions you may have.

Preparing for the event

Physical and technical preparation

- Consult your **toolbox** for pro tips (training program, stretching and strengthening, etc.).
- Enjoy the **12H de vélo en route to the Tour CIBC Charles-Bruneau** (May 11).

Bike mechanics

- Reminder: for all long distances, it's important to have a bike in good order. Before the event, check your bike (condition of tires, mechanics in good working order).
- Every morning during the event, check tire pressure, chain oil, etc.;
- A free mechanical service will be offered throughout the course by Techno Cycle. *Please note that any spare parts needed are at the participants' expense.*

Equipment and materials

Here is a reminder of the important things to bring with you:

- All Tour 2024 items provided to you*.
- Bike shoes and overshoes;
- Windproof / waterproof / sleeveless jacket
- Arm and leg warmers;
- Sunglasses and sunscreen lotion;
- Health insurance card

From June 29 to July 5, spread the word about the cause with your final fundraising efforts.

On social media

Fundraising efforts in the run-up to the event are certainly very important. But being active on social media during the week of the Tour will also have a big impact:

- 2. Invite/inform your network of the challenge you've set yourself (sporting and fundraising). Publish a video (or text) explaining your challenge.

 - Make a video during or after completing your challenge.
 - Add a link to your participating profile to all your publications and remind the community that there's still time to give.

The Tour CIBC Charles-Bruneau is a not-to-be-missed cycling event, which this year will be its 27th edition. Since its inception, the event has raised over \$40 million, enabling the Charles-Bruneau Foundation to give children with cancer in Quebec the best possible chance of recovery, by funding research and projects dedicated to pediatric hemato-oncology.

This year, from June 29 to July 5, more than 850 cyclists will ride, in person or from a distance, in the shared hope of putting an end to pediatric cancer. They will be paired with children from the Charles-Bruneau family, who are either in treatment or in remission from cancer.

About the Charles-Bruneau Foundation

Since 1990, the mission of the Charles-Bruneau Foundation has been to give all children with cancer the best possible chance of recovery.

Thanks to investments of over \$40 million, specialized Charles-Bruneau units have been set up at the four university hospital centres that treat children with cancer in Quebec: CHU Sainte-Justine, the Montreal Children's Hospital, CIUSSS de l'Estrie-CHUS and CHU de Québec-Université Laval.

With the commitments announced in 2021, research funding will total \$55 million since its inception, making it the leading funder of pediatric hemato-oncology research in Quebec.

Efforts that make a difference

By taking part in the Tour CIBC Charles-Bruneau, you're making a direct contribution to a healthy future for all children with cancer in Quebec.

Currently, over **2,000 children in Quebec have cancer,** and nearly **300 new cases are diagnosed each year**. Thanks to the money invested in research since 1990, **the hope of a cure has risen from 30% to over 80%**.
